The Quadra Island Seed Swap is a long-running, community-organized event operating on a shoestring budget, made possible by the generosity of local residents and seed companies that donate seeds and informational materials. Our goals are to provide equitable access to seeds and knowledge, with a strong focus on fostering the exchange of ideas that naturally occurs when gardeners gather together.

We emphasize local seed strains, heritage plants, seed-saving knowledge, wild plants, pollinators, and local food resilience.

Join us on March 30th from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the Quadra Community Centre for the annual island seed swap. Please package seeds in advance as much as possible. A seed packaging day will be announced for early March, where you can bring seeds, envelopes (tea packaging works wonderfully), and your helping hands to assist with packaging your seeds and those of others.

We welcome volunteers to help with soliciting seed donations, organizing seed packaging, and assisting with event setup and takedown. This year, we are particularly emphasizing Quadra seed strains and wildflowers.





Death Education Fair - Way to Go

For many, conversations about death remain uncomfortable, often avoided until we have no choice but to face them. Yet, understanding the end of life—just as we do birth, growth, and change—can provide clarity, reduce fear, and help us make informed choices that align with our values.

Join Way To Go for a Death Education Fair on Sunday, March 2nd, from 1:00 – 4:00 pm at the Quadra Community Centre. This event offers a welcoming space to explore topics of aging, death, dying, and grief with openness and curiosity. Our goal is to expand awareness, foster comfort with these important conversations, and highlight local, natural, and community-centered approaches to end-of-life care.

The Fair will feature informational tables covering topics such as estate and personal planning, community-led death care, natural burial, caskets and shrouds, Threshold Choir, hospice, grief and loss, MAiD, and more. Attendees are encouraged to browse at their own pace, ask questions, and engage with knowledgeable members of their own community who can offer guidance and insight.

You are invited to bring a picture or memento to place on the "In Remembrance" table. In this way, you can acknowledge your grief for those you miss, and show your gratitude for how their lives have touched yours.

In the Green Room, relax in the Death Cafe and engage in guided conversation while enjoying tea and cookies.

In the Yoga Room, we'll have four scheduled 20-minute presentations on: Compassionate Communities, Estate and Personal Planning, Community-Led Death Care, and the Quadra Island Cemetery.

The result of living in a society that is shy to talk about death is that our knowledge about what is possible is often narrow and limited. Hearing words like hospice, palliative, and death can paralyze us. While we still have the capacity to explore and the time to ponder, let us acknowledge our mortality and empower ourselves with knowledge.

The Death Education Fair is an opportunity to learn, expand, reflect, and connect in a relaxed environment. Whether you're planning ahead, supporting a loved one, or simply curious, we look forward to seeing you on March 2nd at the Quadra Community Centre.

Way To Go strives to integrate death as part of life by initiating conversations, providing education, and encouraging people to prepare for end-of-life. Free Climate Solutions Workshop

Bomb Cyclone? Really?! As extreme storms, droughts, flooding, and forest fires have made climate change deeply personal in BC over the past five years, an increasing number of people are experiencing climate anxiety. The climate crisis can feel too big to stop or even mitigate, but over 200 international scientific researchers say it is possible. Solutions already exist to counter this crisis, based on the work of **Project Drawdown** and **Project Regeneration. Hope lies in implementing these actions.**

Did you know that two of the most powerful climate solutions happen **in our kitchens** rather than in the cars we drive? Would changing cooking methods in a distant country actually make a difference? Do we really need to talk about this?

Finding Climate Solutions is a fast-paced, interactive 1.5-hour workshop where these and other key questions will be explored. ICAN and the newly formed Quadra Island Land Trust Society are jointly hosting this workshop on February 19, 1:00–2:30 PM in Room #3 at the Quadra Island Community Centre (following Community lunch). The workshop is presented by Regenerate BC, a registered nonprofit society dedicated to climate change education.

A more in-depth **five-week course** will be available (for those age-eligible) through **Campbell River Elder College** in **March 2025.**

Notice of Alternative Approval Process Heriot Bay Fire Hall #2 Construction Project



The Trustees of the South Quadra Island Fire Protection District are seeking the approval of the property owners in the District through an Alternative Approval Process (AAP) to adopt a loan authorization bylaw. The purpose of the bylaw is to borrow funds for construction of a new Fire Hall #2 for the Quadra Island Fire Department on property owned by the South Quadra Island Fire Protection District at 1525 West Road in Heriot Bay.

The South Quadra Island Fire Protection District proposes to borrow funds from RBC for construction and to convert that borrowing to a loan through the BC Surveyor of Taxes when the new Fire Hall is completed. The amount to be borrowed is up to \$2.9 million. The estimated yearly cost of the borrowing to each property is \$23.50 per \$100,000 of assessed property value, to be paid through taxation, and the term of the loan will be up to 20 years.

The new Fire Hall #2 in Heriot Bay will replace the current hall, which was built in 1970 on leased property. When construction is complete, the Quadra Island Fire Department will have a Fire Hall in Heriot Bay that is compliant with current building codes and meets the needs of a modern Fire Department serving a growing population (currently numbering approximately 2,700).

The Trustees of the South Quadra Island Fire Protection District will commit to borrowing the money through the adoption of "Hall #2 Construction Borrowing Bylaw" unless by Thursday, March 27, 2025 at 12:00 midnight at least 10 per cent (167) of the eligible voters in the South Quadra Island Fire Protection District indicate their opposition to the borrowing by signing an Owner Response Form. The Alternative Approval Process applies to the entire area within the boundaries of the South Quadra Island Fire Protection District.

For the purpose of conducting this AAP, the number of eligible electors is determined to be 1668. If at least 10% (167) or more electors return signed Owner Response Forms by the deadline, the bylaw cannot be adopted without approval of the landowners through a referendum or a vote at a Special General Meeting.

An informational letter is being mailed to registered property owners in the District. An information package is available at www.gifirehall2. ca and at Fire Hall #1 at 844 Heriot Bay Road in Quathiaski Cove. Starting on February 20, 2025, Owner Response Forms can be requested via email to gifirehallreplacement@gmail.com or downloaded from www.gifirehall2.ca. The Forms will also be available at Fire Hall #1. Fire Hall #1 is open between 9:00 am and 3:00 pm, Monday to Thursday (unless staff are responding to an emergency).

The only Owner Response Form that will be accepted by the South Quadra Island Fire Protection District is the one provided by the District, or an accurate copy of the form. A legible scan or photograph of the form is also acceptable.

Deadline: Completed and signed Owner Response Forms must be received by the Returning Officer by 12:00 midnight on Thursday, March 27, 2025.

In accordance with the South Quadra Island Fire Protection District Letters Patent as amended from time to time, you are eligible to submit an Owner Response Form if you are: a Canadian citizen; and, age 18 or older on the day of submission; and, an owner of property in the South Quadra Island Fire Protection District; and, gualified to be registered as a voter in British Columbia; or, the authorized agent of any board or corporation that is an owner of land in the District; or, the legal representative of any owner of land in the South Quadra Island Fire Protection District who has died, become insolvent or is incapacitated and who is gualified to be registered as a voter in British Columbia.

Only those people who own property or are legal representatives of property owners in the South Quadra Island Fire Protection District may submit an Owner Response Form. No person may submit more than one Owner Response Form.

The Danger of Apathy: Why We Must Stay Engaged in Democracy

This moment needs us all.

Watching ignorance, constitutional erosion, and hate spread through the US is deeply disturbing. Donald Trump's rhetoric and policies have fueled division, disinformation, and a dangerous erosion of democratic norms (threatening judges?). His reckless stance on climate change threatens the planet's habitability, and similar trends are emerging here in Canada.

Pierre Poilievre's rise in federal politics has sparked concerns about the spread of populist, divisive, and regressive ideas. If we want to stop this regression and build a better, safer, more inclusive world, we need more people to actively engage in democracy. The stakes are too high to sit on the sidelines.

The Cost of Cynicism

Frustration with the political system is understandable, but disengagement only strengthens those who thrive on division and apathy. Many of us aren't voting, and democracy asks so much more of us. This disengagement leaves the field wide open for bad actors—both foreign and domestic—who seek to undermine democracy and push harmful agendas.

The solution to apathy and the polycrisis, including climate change, is the same: inspiring policies, powered and guarded by masses of engaged citizens. We must take action to build a political culture rooted in mutual aid, solidarity, and care for others.

How to Make a Difference:

• *Mobilize across political divides:* Support organizations that rise above partisanship to push for collective solutions. Check out <u>Cooperate for Canada Com-</u> mon Horizon, or <u>Don't Get Played</u>. Demand political coalitions and <u>electoral reform</u>.

• Get involved with a political party: Join a party that aligns (enough) with your values and help shape its policies. Volunteer, support their efforts, and amplify their ambition on pro-social policies. Good people are working in every party—you won't be alone.

• Support community-building policies: Advocate for solutions to systemic issues like inequality, racism, and climate change. Back leaders who listen to diverse voices and work toward inclusive solutions.

• Engage in conversations: Talk to friends, family, and neighbours about the importance of organizing, voting, and staying informed. Share your concerns and hopes for the future, and encourage others to get involved.

• Support candidates: Don't let frustration with party leaders stop you from supporting local candidates who genuinely care and are real humans. Volunteer and donate to help them win.

• Vote: While voting is the least impactful action on this list, it's still essential. Your vote is your voice, and it's one of the tools we have to shape the future.

Building a Better World

The rise of dangerous politicians and ideologies is a wake-up call. Democracy is not a spectator sport—it's something we all have to fight for. By staying engaged, we can ensure the future is shaped by those who care about building a better, more inclusive world.

And here's the thing: we need to organize political power anyway to achieve the levels of ambition required for climate safety. It's a win-win.


